The UNISG student apartments may feature double rooms and mixed gender.

The lunch service at the Academic Tables Dining Hall is only included on days in which academic activities are scheduled.

ART. 1 – WHO CAN APPLY FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP

Only non-Italian citizens from low-income countries or lower middle income or upper middle-income countries can apply if:

- they have been admitted during the first or second admission session (March or May 2024) to the first year of the Graduate Degree for the 2024/2025 with a **minimum admission score of 75/100²**;
- they are already in possession of an undergraduate degree;
- they are awarded their degree by the extraordinary graduation session of the 2023/2024 academic year;
- whose ISEE (income)/ISPE (property) amounts do not exceed the limits indicated in the table.

ART. 2 – WHO CANNOT APPLY FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP

Students cannot apply for the scholarship if:

- they have not been admitted to the academic year for which they are applying for a scholarship;
- they have submitted the application after the deadline (Art. 3);
- they have not sent the requested documentation (Attachments 1 or 2);
- they have a family member already awarded a UNISG scholarship;
- they already have a Graduate degree (equivalent to a Master degree).

¹ According to the [World Bank list of economies](#) (list as of July 2023), candidates are divided into the following income groups, based on their citizenship and residence: low income, lower middle income, upper middle income and high income.

² Applicants' admission scores, which are out of 100 points, are based on merit criteria as outlined in the "Admission Process Instructions" document, available on the UNISG website under "Admissions".

ART. 3 – WHEN AND HOW SHOULD I SUBMIT THE APPLICATION?

The applications can be:

- submitted in person to the Registrar Office during business hours
- or
- sent via e-mail to segreteria@unisg.it, indicating in the subject of the email “*Scholarship application a.y. 24/25- Graduate Degree*”.



- Applications must be received by **May 21, 2024**.

The documents sent must be readable, in pdf or word format.

The University may request the original documents in paper form.

Those who have not received a confirmation email within 3 working days after submitting the document are invited to contact the Registrar Office.

ART. 4 – HOW IS THE RANKING DRAWN UP

The ranking of suitable candidates is prepared in descending order on the basis of the admission score.

In case of equal final score, the person with the highest score achieved during the admission interview will benefit from the exemption. In case of a further equal score, the youngest candidate will be assigned the fee exemption.



The ranking will be published on the University Website (www.unisg.it) by **May 28, 2024**.

ART. 5 – WHAT THE EXEMPTION CONSISTS OF AND HOW DO I KEEP IT

Who obtains the scholarship:

- does not receive any amount of money;
- must not pay the tuition fee for the amount of the exemption he/she was assigned;
- must meet the merit requirements to keep the scholarship in the second and third year (Attachment 3).
- may stay in feature double rooms and mixed gender at the UNISG student apartments;
- can benefit from the lunch service at the Academic Tables Dining Hall only on days in which academic activities are scheduled.

ART. 6 – CHECK OF SELF-CERTIFICATIONS

Check of economic status

The University checks the self-certifications sent in relation to the economic status. The University may request suitable documentation at any time to demonstrate the completeness and truthfulness of the data declared.

Penalties

In case of false declarations, the student will lose:

- the benefits obtained (Art. 75 of Presidential Decree 445/2000),
- the right to obtain other payments for the duration of the study program.



Data processing

Upon submitting their signed self-declaration form, students are informed of European law, Reg.(UE) 2016/679, and Italian legislative Decree n. 196 of 30 June 2003, and subsequent amendments and additions, as well as the provisions of the authority that guarantees protection of personal data.

Students' personal data, which must be provided for the purposes of determining eligibility and assigning scholarships, are processed exclusively for the purposes of managing this announcement and are stored at the University of Gastronomic Sciences – Academic and Registrar Office, with corresponding records kept in digital format. Students who fail to provide said data cannot be evaluated and will therefore be excluded from the process.

As per the above-mentioned Legislative Decree, candidates may exercise their right to correct, update, complete or erase inaccurate or incomplete data or data collected in violation of current privacy laws.
